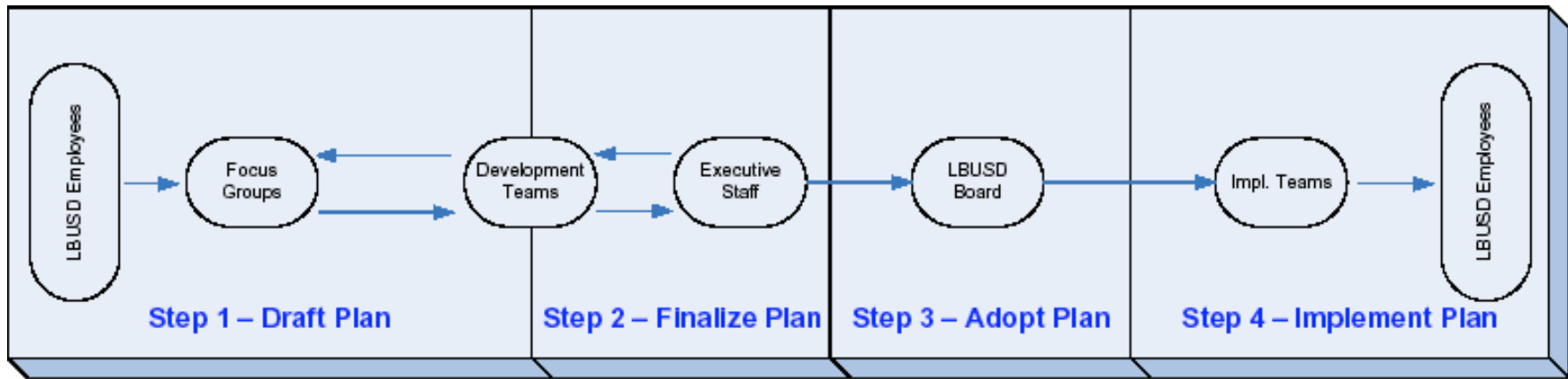


The Technology Master Plan Process

The development of the Technology Master Plan was a highly interactive process involving a broad spectrum of stakeholders. Nearly 1,000 teachers, classified staff, and administrators from both the Central Office and school sites participated in committee meetings or surveys. A districtwide technology inventory covered over 20,000 workstations and equipment. This entire 18-month planning process ensured that the final document considered all district requirements and provided maximum benefit to students.
